## Product

## **Product description:**

Solid concrete walls are a homogeneous element that is usually used as an interior or exterior wall. The walls are cast on horizontal mold tables with one side that is counter-moulded and with one side that is machined, up in form. Walls are manufactured in different thicknesses depending on the desired function. With concrete walls, very good properties are obtained in terms of sound insulation, fire resistance and moisture safety. Another of concrete's important properties is its ability to store heat, which enables low energy consumption and a lower power usage during the building's entire operating life.

Concrete walls are 100% recyclable and enable fast, cost-effective and rational progress in the construction project.

Declared element is 1 tonne concrete wall which is 200mm thick in concrete quality C35/45, vct 0.50 and contains an average amount of reinforcement of 19,8kg/ton and average amount of cast steel of 1,5kg/ton. Declared unit also applies to wall thicknesses 150-400mm with average amount of reinforcement and average amounts of casting materials. Cement is Heidelberg Materials Bascement CEM II 42.5 R.

Concrete strength C35/45. Exposure classes up to XC4-XF1. Life length class up to L100 (100 years).

All major raw materials and all the essential energy is included. The production processes for raw materials and energy flows with very small amounts (less than 1%) are not included. These cut-off criteria do not apply for hazardous materials and substances.

#### Allocation:

The allocation is made in accordance with the provisions of EN 15804. Incoming energy and water and waste production in-house is allocated equally among all products through mass allocation. Effects of primary production of recycled materials is allocated to the main product in which the material was used. The recycling process and transportation of the material is allocated to this analysis.

#### Data quality:

Specific data for the product composition are provided by the manufacturer. The data represent the production of the declared product and were collected for EPD development in the year of study. Background data is based on EPDs according to EN 15804 and different LCA databases. The data quality of the raw materials in A1 is presented in the table below.



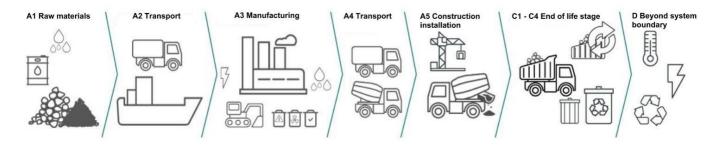
