Product description:

Nordic S2 RER (art. 800110) is an air ventilation unit developed for energy efficiency in the Nordic climate and is suitable for instalment apartments, houses, villas and small commercial buildings.

The unit includes rotating heat recuperators, with a temperature efficiency up to 85%, and fans with low energy consumption, as well as a cooling recovery and a defrost function. It is controlled via the Flexit GO app, and can be supplemented with various accessories (wireless or wired), e.g. control panel, moisture sensor, or CO2 sensor.

Placement is upright on the wall, on the floor, or suspended from the ceiling, in both hot and cold zones.

Cut-off criteria:

Allocation:

The allocation is made in accordance with the provisions of EN 15804. Energy, water and waste production in-house is allocated equally among all products through mass allocation. Effects of primary production of recycled materials is allocated to the main product in which the material was used. The recycling process and transportation of the material is allocated to this analysis.



Data quality:

Specific data for the product composition are provided by the manufacturer. The data represent the production of the declared product and were collected for EPD development in the year of study. 
