## Product

### Product description:

Com is a model characterized by lightness, durability and multifunctionality. With the refined geometry of the seat shell, it is also very comfortable. This chair designed by Paul Brooks is perfect for auditoriums, meeting rooms and canteens.

### Collection features:

- five types of bases allow any configuration
- the collection is completed with a barstool on a metal wire frame
- the square shape of the shell has four finishing options: plywood, with upholstered seat pad, with seat and backrest pad or fully upholstered
- the shell can come in different finishes: lacquered plywood, lined with natural veneer or HPL laminate which is scratch resistant

### Product specification

The allocation is made in accordance with the provisions of EN 15804. Incoming energy and water and waste production in-house is allocated equally among all products through mass allocation. Effects of primary production of recycled materials is allocated to the main product in which the material was used. The recycling process and transportation of the material is allocated to this analysis.

**Data quality:**

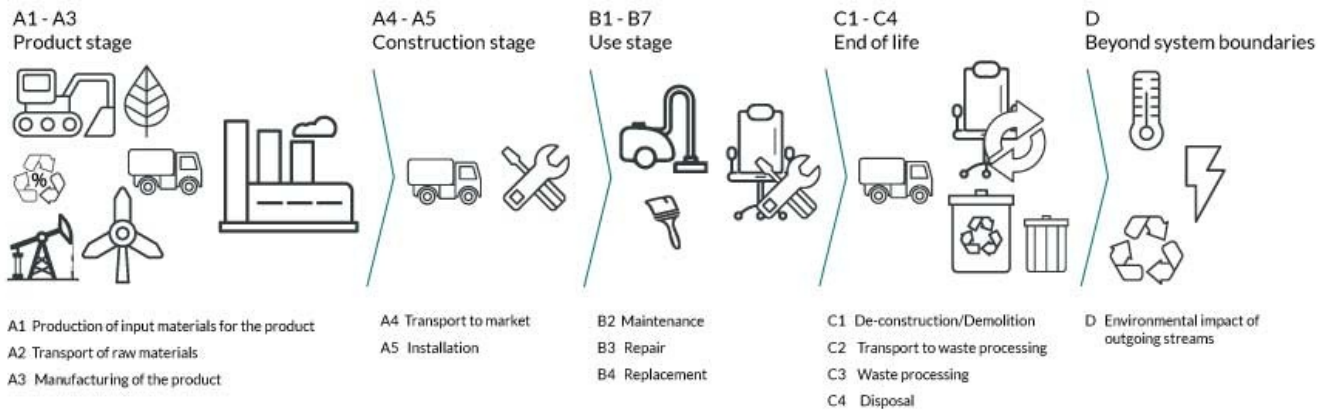
